► **OVERVIEW**

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) awarded Texas \$4.383 billion in Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds for mitigation activities related to the 2015 and 2016 Floods and Hurricane Harvey. HUD rules detailing program requirements will be published in a Federal Register Notice in the coming months.

Since 2015, 140 Texas counties have received a Presidential disaster declaration. The Texas General Land Office (GLO), the governor-designated state agency responsible for administering all CDBG-DR funds awarded to the state, is currently working to develop the HUD-required mitigation State Action Plan. A critical component of this plan involves vital stakeholder input.

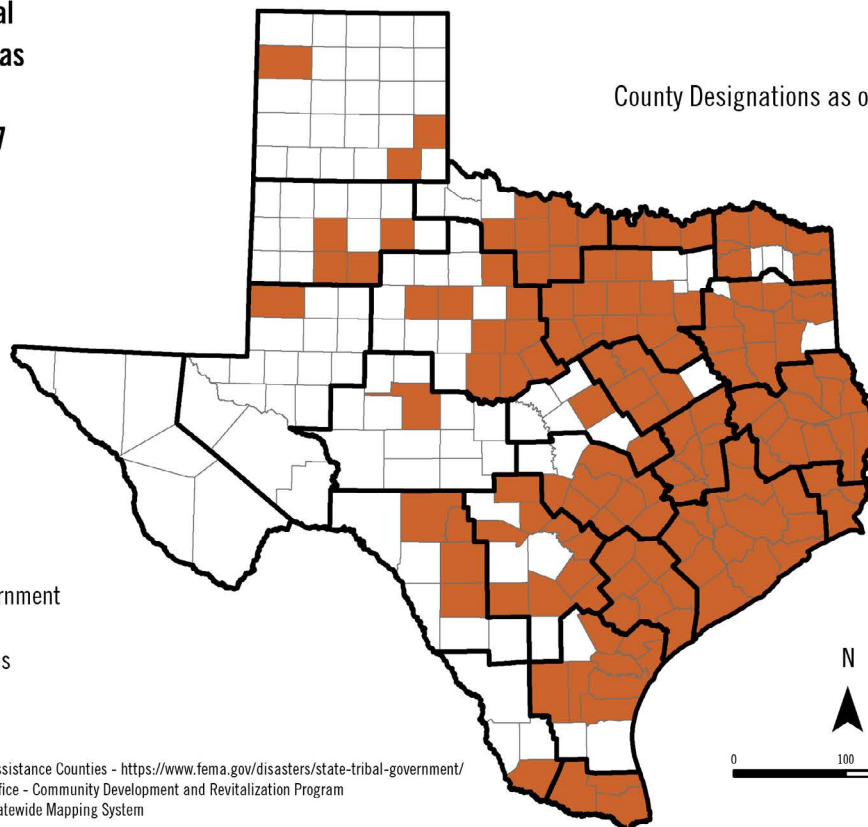

2015, 2016 & 2017**

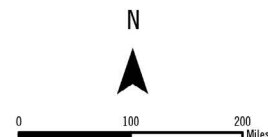
